THIRTY-SEVEN POLLUTION PREVENTION PROJECTS FUNDED

(Harrisburg) – Pennsylvania's County Conservation Districts today were awarded more than \$69,840 for 37 projects in 31 counties. The projects promote water pollution prevention activities through the Non-point Source (NPS) Pollution Prevention Educational Mini-Grant Program. The projects will take place over the next 13 months.

"PACD is excited to announce another round of educational projects coming soon to Pennsylvania's residents thanks to funding from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection," said Shannon Wehinger, Director of Communications & Education for the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts (PACD). "There are a wide variety of projects this year including storm drain stenciling in communities, cover crop workshops for farmers, and various clean water campaigns for homeowners."

Funding for the grants, up to \$2,000 each, is provided through the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act, administered by the US Environmental Protection Agency.
