Potential PACD Policy for Consideration Fall 2019 PACD Region Meetings

Policy from the PACD Conservation Committee:

The PACD Conservation Committee proposed this policy during its July 17, 2019, meeting.

PACD supports legislation to raise Pennsylvania's clean fill standards to be in line with New Jersey, New York, and other neighboring states.

Policy from the PACD Legislative Committee:

The PACD Legislative Committee proposed this policy during its July 17, 2019, meeting.

PACD opposes legislation allowing for unreported discharges, spills or releases into waters of the Commonwealth that are not authorized by a DEP permit.

Policy from the Spring 2019 North East Region Meeting:

The PACD north east region passed a motion opposing House Bill 414 during its meeting on April 5, 2019.

PACD opposes legislation such as House Bill 414 (2019-2020 Session) that reduces the allowable timeframe for permit approvals or disapprovals, regardless of the entity submitting the permit application.

Call to Order

Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the minutes of the 2018 fall meeting by Heather Manzo, second by Chuck Duritsa. Passed unanimously.

PACD Business & Report by Brenda Shambaugh (Handouts)

- Discussed the TAG Program to the new district directors
- Discussed State Budget
- Proposed \$869,00 Flat Line Budget. Did not lose any funding from previous years.
- Nutrient Management received a \$3.5 Million Increase.
- DEP Budget \$2.5 Million stagnant, No increase (Handout)
- The Third Party Reviewer Legislation was re-introduced, since it was previously voted on by the SW Region before, no motion was needed at this time. (Handout)
- Discussed E&S Manual for Agriculture Operations (Handout)
- Discussed Conservation District Week May 5-11, 2019 (Handout)
- Discussed ways & Means Committee dues increase (Handout)
- Discussed Ad Hoc Building Committee update (Handout)
- Discussed Directors List Serve (Handout)



Governor requests moving the DEP money to the Environmental Stewardship fund to protect district funding. Difficulties that could arise from moving the money are: If it were zeroed out, nobody would notice, making it difficult to get put back in the budget. Most other districts decided they would rather take their chances with the money staying in the DEP budget.

Motion made by Doug Beri, second by John Dryzal, to oppose using the Environmental Stewardship Fund to pay Admin costs (PACD continues to support utilizing the Environmental Stewardship Fund (ESF) to fund the Growing Greener Program and its success in assisting local communities with natural resource projects. We philosophically oppose using ESF funding from the to pay for agency administrative costs). Motion passed unanimously.

Motion made by John Dryzal, second by Doug Beri, to support Conservation District funding in the DEP general fund to continue in the existing fund structure. Passed unanimously.

Regional Info Sharing

Indiana – New Manager Hired in November (Doug Beri). Received 3 grants from Mariner East (Pipeline Fine). Anticipating doing a few Ag. projects to help keep Buttermilk Falls Clean. Working on a Growing Greener grant for Yellowcreek Watershed. Building a new office building.

Washington – Hired a new Manager (Todd Thornburg). Working on setting up trainings for Municipalities in the county. Talking with WPCAMR about getting AML funding for subsidence and AMD discharges. Having a VIP Brief for conservation week letting people know what the CD does and how they can help.

Cambria – The Envirothon, Trout Release and a meeting with the County Commissioners all happinging during conservation district week. Waiting for weather to break so projects can be constructed. ePermits for CH105 items have been problematic so far.

Westmoreland – Holding 70th Anniversary celebration. Fixed up nature trail around office building. Looking to daylight Bull Run near Jeanette. A need for maintenance tax was brought up to commissioners in the form of possibly using a hotel tax. Currently 9 DGLVR projects underway. Bolivar project was sent to bid but came back high, so being re-worked. Over 400 people attended the Engineers Workshop.

Greene – Working on sign-ups for the GRACE Program. Twenty-four DGLVR Projects being processed. Their Envirothon is the Thursday during conservation week, the district will be doing radio ads and Greensaver will be sent out as advertisement. Ch. 105 Permits have dwindled out due to permits going to DEP regional office or to Harrisburg for review.

Allegheny – New Director hired (Heather Manzo). Drafted new manual of Best Practices. Legislator Engagement Committee keeping legislators informed of the work they do. Social Media numbers have doubled recently. Looking to begin Strategic Planning for the future. Helping to launch largest Urban Farm in the U.S. Two farms recently went to contract for farmland preservation.
