# PRISM Pilot for NW Conservation Districts Education & Outreach Sub-Grants

Protecting PA from Invasive Species: Building Partnerships for Regional Invasive Species Management

The program will pilot Partnerships for Regional Invasive Species Management (PRISMs) in 13 Northwestern counties in Pennsylvania. The PRISM program will address the critical need to manage invasive species that threaten Pennsylvania's economy, environment, and human and animal health by developing strong, diverse stakeholder partnerships. By bringing together many partners, the program will lessen the burden of invasive species management and increase restoration of the native landscape.

PACD is offering conservation districts up to \$2,000 to implement educational and outreach activities that focus on invasive species detection and management.

### **Timeline**

- Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until funds are expended
- Deadline for final reports: April 30, 2027

## **Target Audience**

The education & outreach projects should be offered to the public and include a variety of stakeholders including farmers, gardeners, hikers, hunters, fishermen, grassroots organizations, partner groups and organizations, scientists and academics, public and private industry, and other outdoor enthusiasts.

PACD recommends working with underserved populations and/or organizations.

## **Project Examples**

- <u>Project Tours</u> Show off your invasive species management projects by inviting partners and the public to the site.
- <u>Guided Walks</u> Take a little stroll with folks to show them how to identify invasive species and report findings to iMapInvasives.
- <u>Invasive Visuals and Factsheets</u> Be creative! Develop your own factsheets and informational pieces on invasive species. OR use existing information. Please feel free to share your work with other districts!
- <u>Photo Gallery</u> Create a space for people to upload invasive species images so they can be shared widely for ID and management.
- Workshops and Trainings Provide classroom or in the field workshops to teach the community to identify and combat invasive species.

• <u>Community Science Projects</u> – Recruit volunteers to help record data or help remove invasive species. Collect and share the results of pulling in a network of volunteers!

## **Eligible Expenses**

Grants pay for eligible expenses on a reimbursement basis. Please submit your reimbursement request with your final report. The following items are NOT considered reimbursable expenses: food & drink; novelty items including t-shirts, magnets, pens, etc. Mileage will be reimbursed at the current approved state rate.

**Match:** A 50:50 match is required for this grant. The following partner organizations have graciously pledged match and PACD strongly encourages including them in your E&O efforts.
