

The Butler County Conservation District hosted a CREP/BMP Field Day on July 28th, 2023, at the BGN Farm owned by Jeff Grazier. Farmers interested in participating with the CREP program registered with FSA for the opportunity to learn about Jeff's operation and the different programs and funding sources

available to assist farms in Bulter County. In 2013, BGN Farms installed a 3.75-acre CREP (Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program) buffer along approximately 1,430 feet of stream passing through the farm's pastures. Jeff spoke

on his willingness to give up pastureland to be converted into buffer for the sake of improving water quality. Attendees also learned about grazing/watering systems and the importance of pasture management when it comes to invasive plants and maintaining good pasture height. Jeff also talked about his manure storage and heavy use area that he completed under an EQIP contract. We thank
